


The poll this month featured questions about mental health. The first question asked on the survey was "Do you turn to your parents for advice?" 30% of the students who took this survey answered with "sometimes." The word "often" had 25%, and the next answer was "all the time" with 12.5%. The next answer was "not at all" with 10% and lastly the next highest answer was "Just dad."

The second statement was "Students should get mental health day off from school" and the top answer with 35% was strongly agree. Not very many participants in this survey disagreed with this statement.

"Do you feel that your phone is a positive part of your life?" was the third question in the survey. Most students chose the answer "Yes, it is a great tool to use to communicate and relax." This was answered by 45% of the participants.

The fourth question was "What things cause you to feel the most stress?" 75% of students who took the survey answered the question by choosing the answer "school/classes/homework." The next highest answer was "money & finances, current or future" with 32.5% respondents choosing that option.

The poll ended with the question "How can school better support the mental health of students?" 41.03% of students chose the answer "Establish school-wide homework policies to limit the daily amount of homework."

Former President Trump In Court
