District Communication Efforts

Each of the three schools in Eureka County School District host two full-day parent conference opportunities each year, one in the fall and one in the spring. Teachers regularly call or email parents with concerns, and it is our policy that teachers notify parents any time a student's grade falls 20% or more. As we are small schools in a small community, much informal parent-teacher interaction takes place. Sporting events, grocery shopping and excursions to the post office all provide opportunities for discussions.

Discipline

Policies regarding bullying are published in our student handbooks, which are reviewed each fall in classrooms. During opening-of-school assemblies, principals remind students of the laws and our expectations regarding such behaviors, and similar reminders are included in the first monthly parent newsletter. Counselor and administrators address individual bullying or cyber bullying issues, as they arise, quickly and according to policy.
